

## Stone China S9

An impressed mark, rare in the UK but more common in the USA. Slight variations have been noted but all seem to date from the 1850s to the 1870s.

This mark was also used with marks E12 and E15.



Stonewares and earthenwares usually only bear numerals for even years. There are a few rare exceptions such as the dolls' plates (bottom right) with 5 and 3 either side of the anchor (for 1853). This early form of this mark was used in the 1850s and seems to have been modified in the 1860s with an external date stamp giving month and year, similar to marks E12 and E13.
